

TRAFFIC AND PARKING

This brochure summarizes traffic and parking regulations for the College. Official regulations are published in the Dyersburg State Community College (DSCC) Catalog and Student Handbook. It is your responsibility to comply with the official regulations. Regulations are applicable to all students, faculty, staff and visitors. These regulations aim to facilitate safe and orderly traffic flow and parking within the limits of available space. The acceptance of a parking permit shall constitute acceptance of the regulations.

Vehicle Damage

DSCC is not responsible for loss or damage to any vehicle or to the contents of any vehicle parked or being operated on the campus. We recommend removing your keys from the ignition switch when you park your vehicle, placing all valuables out of sight, and locking your doors.

Vehicle Registration

- Dyersburg State Community College requires all motor vehicles parked on College property to be registered with the College annually and to display a permit.
- The permit should be placed on the rearview mirror of the registered vehicle and the permit number and expiration date should always be visible.
- Anyone intending to operate more than one vehicle on College property must register and obtain a permit for each vehicle annually.

- Any vehicle driven on College property must be registered at the Learning Resource Centers at the Dyersburg campus or the Jimmy Naifeh Center at Tipton County or at the administrative office Henry County.
- Faculty and staff should purchase a permit at the beginning of the academic year in August for \$20.00. Student permits are included in their student fees.

VISITOR PARKING

Designated visitor parking spaces are provided. A visitor is defined as a person not enrolled or employed at the College, but one who occasionally has business or other legitimate reasons to be at a DSCC location. Students and staff should not use visitor spaces.

WHERE, WHERE NOT, AND HOW TO PARK

Where to park:

- Faculty and staff should park within the yellow lines.
- Students should park within the white lines.
- In areas designated as visitor parking, parking is limited to vehicles belonging to visitors.

Vehicles improperly parked in these areas will receive tickets and may be towed at the owner's expense.

Where not to park:

- Loading areas
- Sidewalks or campus lawn
- Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant
- Any area marked "No Parking"
- Restricted areas without the proper tag or permit

How To Park:

- Backing in or pulling through parking spaces is allowed.
- Vehicle must be parked in a single parking space.
- Vehicles must not park on or over the line.
- Large vehicles which protrude beyond the parking space should back in.

HANDICAPPED PARKING

In areas designated handicapped with the blue emblem, parking is limited to vehicles displaying handicap tags or license plates issued by the State or vehicles displaying permits issued by the DSCC Counseling Office. Students with State issued handicap tags should register them with the Counseling Office.

MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATIONS

- All State of Tennessee Motor Vehicle Laws are applicable on College property 24 hours a day.
- Vehicles must yield the right-of-way to all emergency vehicles by pulling over and coming to a complete stop.
- Pedestrians have the right-of-way. Motorists must yield the right-of-way to all pedestrians.
- All vehicles must come to a complete stop at intersections where stop signs are located, painted on streets, or mounted on posts.
- The speed limit on all College property streets is 15 mph; on parking lots the speed limit is 10 mph.
- Passing on College property streets is prohibited.
- Operating a motor vehicle in any area other than a street or roadway intended for motor vehicles is prohibited.

ENFORCEMENT AND PAYMENT OF CITATIONS

Fines:

- For moving vehicle violations, and parking and registration citations, other than handicapped violations: \$10.00 for first ticket/\$20.00 for each subsequent ticket per semester.
- For illegally parking in a handicapped zone: \$200.00 for each ticket.
- Tickets should be paid in the Business Office at the Dyersburg Campus or the Administrative Offices at the Jimmy Naifeh Center at Tipton County and the Henry County Center or online in your MyDSCC account.

Appeal:

The appeal of any citation may be made to the Traffic Citations Appeal Committee provided a request to appeal is filed with the Business Office within 15 business days after the ticket is issued. If you do not file the notice within 15 business days, you will lose the right of appeal and the fine will be due immediately.

Traffic Appeal Committee:

The committee has four voting members with representatives from faculty, staff and the student body. The Assistant Dean of Student Services is the chairperson and the President of the College is an ex-officio member of the committee. The committee decision will be final with no further appeal available. The committee will meet as needed.

Fine Payment:

Payment of the fine(s) must be made before a student will be permitted to register for any subsequent academic term. Also, no grade report, transcripts or diplomas will be issued to any student with an unpaid debt or obligation to DSCC.
