



MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Fiscal year 2024 was an incredible year at Dyersburg State Community College. Our Fall 2023 census enrollment demonstrated over a 15% growth in student headcount and an 8% growth in Full-time Equivalency (FTE) enrollment. For a third consecutive semester, in spring, Dyersburg State's enrollment was up again: over 14% in headcount and 9% in FTE. On July 1, we opened our Henry County Center and offered our first classes there in August. Dyersburg State has been welcomed in the Henry County community, and we hosted a standing-room-only open house and ribbon cutting on September 20. We have continued to expand dual enrollment, demonstrating a 37% growth in fall and almost 54% in spring. On October 13, Dyersburg State dedicated the Patriot Bank Soccer Field at the Jimmy Naifeh Center. In spring, the college sold the beautiful and historic President's Residence at 933 Troy Avenue and dedicated those resources to an on-campus project that would benefit students, employees, and the community: the renovation of Andersen Hall and the First Citizens National Bank Auditorium.

As we closed another year of serving our community and helping students to achieve their dreams, this report reflects the progress we have made together. Our commitment to excellence drives us forward, and as we look ahead, I am excited about our future and your continued support and partnership.

Our Statement of Vision

As the area's premier institution of higher learning, Dyersburg State Community College will transform the lives of our students and the communities we serve by providing immovative and creative opportunities to learn, grow, and achieve.

About Dyersburg State Community College

Dyersburg State Community College (DSCC) was founded in 1969 by the State Board of Education as the second community college in West Tennessee. In 1969, DSCC opened its doors with approximately 500 students. Today, Dyersburg State provides higher education to thousands of students at three locations: the Dyersburg campus, the Jimmy Naifeh Center at Tipton County, and the Henry County Center in Paris. These convenient locations help serve the communities of Crockett, Dyer, Haywood, Henry, Lake, Lauderdale, Obion, Tipton, and Weakley counties. Dyersburg State has become a major resource for workforce development and training for regional business and industry.

Offering courses in the arts and sciences; career, technical and distance education; and musing; Dyersburg State provides high-quality career programs and courses for traditional and nontraditional students. These programs and courses are designed to enable students to obtain a certificate and/or associate degree for professional career opportunities or to easily transfer to a four-year university through the Tennessee Transfer Pathways program. In addition, eligible students may participate in a dual admission program with partnerships offered through the University of Tennessee at Martin and Middle Tennessee State University. Dyersburg State also offers guaranteed admission through an agreement with the University of Tennessee at Knoxville.

Instruction is delivered through traditional in-person classes, synchronous Zoom teleconferencing and asynchronous online instruction. Dyersburg State offers a very successful dual enrollment program to eligible high school juniors and seniors. The College also provides learning support courses to prepare students for college-level courses. The Division of Workforce Development offers online and in-person learning opportunities through certificate programs, customized workforce development instruction for local businesses and industries, personal enrichment courses and youth programs. Enriching the culture of West Tennessee through its performing and fine arts programs, Dyersburg State hosts a variety of music concerts and recitals, theatrical productions and art exhibits. Students also have the opportunity to study abroad through the Tennessee Consortium for International Studies (TnCIS).

An Academic Success Center (ASC) is available at each location and offers free tutoring and other resources students need to succeed, such as Accuplacer preparation, printing services, computer lab space, and Zoom teleconferencing stations. The Dyersburg campus provides free access to school supplies and personal hygiene items. Each location offers free access to on-site food pantries where students can obtain nonperishable food items and basic necessities to meet their immediate needs.

The Dyersburg campus is centrally located in the College's nine-county area and is spread over more than 115 acres. In each of the following buildings, you will find state-of-the-art technology: the E.B. Eller Administration Building, the Dale F. Glover Education Center, a Learning Resource Center, a Student Center featuring the Karlgaard One Stop Center to provide multiple services to students, such as, The Dr. Karen A. Bowyer Mathematics Building, Dr. Carl Christian Anderson Hall that includes the 148-seat First Citizens National Bank Auditorium, the Security Bank Community Learning Center, and the E.H. Lannom, Jr. Gymnasium.

The Jimmy Naifeh Center at Tipton County, situated on 102 acres in Covington, was constructed in four phases. The first phase opened in 1996. The center currently consists of three main buildings including the 33,503 square-foot Jimmy Naifeh Building, which houses instructional classrooms, labs, a commons area, an advising center and an on-site bookstore. The Baptist Memorial Health Care Academic Building supports the Nursing, Emergency Medical Services, Paramedic, Engineering Systems Technology, and Criminal Justice programs and includes a 244-seat auditorium. In fall 2014, the College celebrated the grand opening of a 54,000 square foot Learning Resource Center, Student Center and Tipton County Public Library. This building offers students and users of the public library access to over 400-computers. Other features include classrooms and computer labs, the Dr. Loren and Elaine Ellis Crown Academic Success Center, the Peter Fyfe Genealogy Room, a children's library, Duke's Café, the Rose Companies Children's Multi-Purpose Lab and Performance Area, and a lab for recreation and physical fitness. The office of Jimmy Naifeh, Speaker Emeritus, Tennessee House of Representatives, is located near the front entrance.

The Henry County Center (HCC) is located at the Henry County Central School Building in Paris, Tennessee. The HCC has administrative offices and classrooms to support students' educational goals. The HCC supports traditional and nontraditional students pursuing general education courses, dual enrollment credit courses, associate degrees through the Tennessee Pathways, certificate programs and non-credit credentials.

Dyersburg State now offers on-site classes at the Tennessee College of Applied Technology (TCAT) Stanton in Stanton, TN.

Dyersburg State Community College & University of Tennessee Health Science Center Sign Articulation Agreement

Dyersburg State Community College and the University of Tennessee Health Science Center's (UTHSC) College of Nursing launched their new partnership on Thursday, July 13. The partnership offers DSCC students a pathway to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program at UTHSC, which is the highest-ranked BSN in Tennessee.



Dyersburg State Community College Signs Articulation Agreement with TCAT Northwest

Dyersburg State Community College signed an articulation agreement with Tennessee College of Applied Technology Northwest on Monday, July 31, at the Dyersburg campus. The articulation agreement will allow TCAT industrial maintenance programs to transfer as credits towards an Associate of Applied Science Degree at Dyersburg State.



DSCC EMT Basic & AEMT Finish First Cohort at Blue Oval City

Dyersburg State Community College's first cohort of non-credit EMT Basic and AEMT students finish the first-year program at the Blue Oval City site. DSCC's Workforce Development, along with Ford Motor Company, Haywood County EMS, and the Tennessee Board of Regents (TBR), launched a unique initial Emergency Medical Services (EMS) education program in which initial EMT Basic and AEMT education was coupled with the first response ALS ambulance service for the Blue Oval construction site. This novel program encompassed the didactic and skills portions of the course at the Haywood County EMS and Fire Station and, at the same time, included clinical experiences from Baptist Memorial Hospital - Tipton ER, Haywood County EMS, Crockett County EMS, Priority EMS - Tipton, and of course, the response territory of Blue Oval City.




Dyersburg State Community College nominated Dr. Karen A. Bowyer, President Emeritus, for the Regents' Award for Excellence in Philanthropy. Dr. Bowyer has contributed to the Dyersburg State Annual Fund since 1986 and awarded more than 113 scholarships to deserving Dyersburg State students since 2008. Dr. Bowyer established the Carlton Bowyer Memorial Endowed Scholarship, the Karen Bowyer Scholarship, and the Laront Dittmer Scholarship. Dr. Karen Bowyer has a cumulative giving total to Dyersburg State of \$197,419.38 as of February 2024. In addition to her cumulative giving, she has made a significant planned gift to the college. The Annual Fund Campaign, which she started in 1985-86, has a cumulative total of \$39,495,998.84, and the Foundation Investments, which she began in 1989, are valued at \$11,094,696.51. Her vision for the future and her generous support have impacted our students' lives and will impact future generations of students. Dr. Bowyer has served as President Emerita of Dyersburg State Community College since 2022.

Operating Expenses by functional classification for the year ended June 30, 2024




